1.1 Community Improvement Program Tipping Fee \$31.50/ton

Recently, there has been some confusion surrounding the applicability of the Community Improvement Program. The purpose of this program is to assist municipalities with the removal or improvement of blighted properties within their jurisdiction. The reduced gate rate for municipal demolition projects is specific to **clean, uncontaminated** construction debris.

In the case of an abandoned or condemned structure, in order to qualify for the Community Improvement Program (CIP) gate rate reduction, there must be documentation that the construction debris is free from any possibility of contamination with asbestos. Typically, this is accomplished by a documented asbestos survey/abatement program.

1.2 Bulk Asbestos Tipping Fee \$80/ton

If an asbestos survey cannot be conducted, the structure is considered to be contaminated with asbestos and does not qualify for the CIP rate. However, we offer a reduced tip fee for bulk asbestos contaminated construction debris. In order to qualify for the reduced asbestos rate, documentation indicating the reason(s) why asbestos abatement could not be completed must be provided as part of the Friable Asbestos Waste Profile. Once accepted, the material is scheduled for delivery and treated as asbestos contaminated. The tipping fee for this type of material is \$80/ton. This is a significant discount from our normal disposal rate.

1.3 Friable Asbestos Tipping Fee \$200/ton

If an asbestos survey determines that the structure contains friable asbestos that has not been abated, the normal tip fee is \$200/ton, with a minimum charge of \$200 (1 ton). For all wastes containing friable asbestos, the *Friable Asbestos Waste Profile* must be submitted, complete with a detailed explanation of the material being profiled.
