Mission:

Our Materials Management Facility and Landfill field trips provide an immersive and educational experience for participants of all ages. Through guided tours, presentations, and hands-on activities, visitors gain valuable insights into waste management processes, recycling techniques, and environmental conservation efforts. Our knowledgeable staff members serve as guides, offering informative commentary and answering questions to enhance the learning experience.



Booking

Customization

Upon booking confirmation, our team works with the organizing group to tailor the field trip experience to the needs and interests of the participants. We accommodate groups of varying sizes and age groups, adjusting the itinerary and content accordingly.

Orientation

On the day of the field trip, participants are greeted by our staff members, who provide a brief orientation and overview of the itinerary. Safety guidelines and procedures are reviewed to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all.

Guided Tours

Participants embark on guided tours of our Materials Management Facility and Landfill, where they witness firsthand the processes involved in waste management, recycling, and landfill operations. Our knowledgeable guides offer insights into the environmental impact of waste and the importance of sustainable practices.

Interactive Activities

The Murray Center

The Murray Center and Trail System are named for former Development Authority board member and chairman, Doug Murray. This will be the meeting point for all tours, where we will discuss expectations, layout of the property, as well as host the mandatory safety briefing. This will an opportunity for the group to use the restroom before the onsite tour begins. The trail has two loops totaling 1.6 miles which highlight the agricultural nature of the property surrounding the solid waste management facility, and are open to the public, year-round. There will be a maintained pollinator garden on this portion of the property.
